## EBOLA TRAVEL CONSIDERATIONS AND PROTOCOLS

As we approach the holiday season during which many may plan to travel, both nationally and internationally, we ask that you closely monitor travel advisories, especially if you or your family members are considering travel to Ebola-affected countries.
